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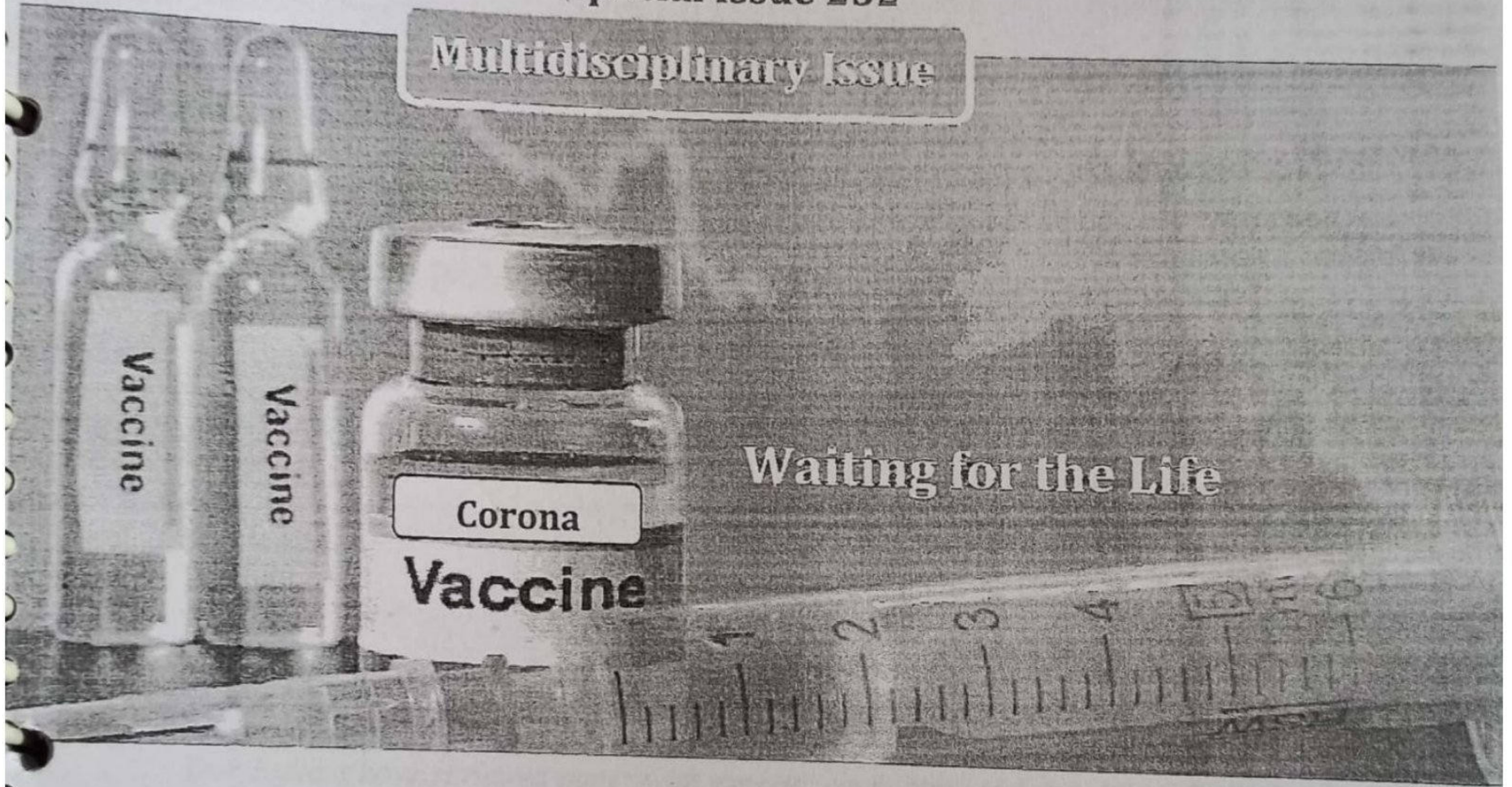

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Geographical Analysis of Tourist Center in Beed District

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1. Introduction :-

Tourism is an economic as well as in industrial activity in which many individuals, firms, corporations, organizations and associations are involved. India has a fantastically rich and varied in tourism potential to deserve a substantially greater tourists inflow than so-called other foreign tourists paradise which have least of almost everything to offer but which somehow manage to get more tourists. The tourists-both domestic and foreign all contribute to develop the economy of the area. To provide employment for the people and afford opportunities to assimilate the best in many and diverse cultures.

Today tourist from an important part of all development strategies and is often present on top of the priority list among the "hierarchy of priorities" Today tourist is perceived as a contributor for. Peace and development, image building, mixing people and culture, development of international relations, infrastructure development, achieving sustainable patterns of environmental up- gradation, upliftment of the society, global in titration.

2. Study Area :-

Beed District is located in the central part of Maharashtra State. Beed is the one of the District of Marathwada region. Beed district lies between 18'3' to 19'3' north latitudes and 74'54 to 76'57' East Longitudes. The east west extension of Beed district is 268 kms. The shape of the Beed district is broadly that of a trapeze, the northern and southern sides of which are nearly parali.

The total Geographical area of Beed district is 10615.3 sq k.m. and it's proportion as compared with Maharashtra state. It is about 3.5%. The proportion of Beed district in Marathwada division is 19.20 percent. Out of total Geographical Area 10380.4 sq km is rural (97.7%) sq.km area was (2.21%) is Urban and (97.79%) rural.

3. Database And Methodology :-

The present study is based on primary and secondary data. Primary data will be collected by field survey. The field survey involved two methods.

1. The Primary data collected by visiting Toronmal Station.
2. Questionnaire is prepared and filled up by tourist.

Secondary data has been collected from socio- Economic review, district census, Hand book of Beed District. And Grampanchyat of toronmal data.

5. Nature of local and tourism center Distribution.

There is variously diversity in nature as view of tourism in Beed District Relief feature, drainage system, North parth of the distribution in plain area of Godawari River South Eastern part of the District is Balaghat plateav physiograhilly Beed District Divided in to three part.

1. Godawari plain region in the north is known as gangathdi Godawari and its tributary flowing in this area Georai Majalgaon, and parli tashil are comes in this part.
2. Second part of the District is Balaghat plateav. Central part of the district is Balaghat in South of the plateav.
3. Third part of District is seena and it's tributary in the west of district.

6. Beed District Tourism :-

1. Beed :- A District head quarter has number of ancient remains. The place was called durgawati in Traditional literature. It has got several gates and muslim monuments and kankaleshwar temple of yadav period is much famous.
2. Ambajogai :- A taluka headquarter is famous as a shakti peetha one among the three and a half peethas. The town is much older it probably existed even before satavahana period bat direct evidence come form Rashtrakutta period found during the exploration this author conducted in and around the town. The town is attraction not only for tourist but for the students of the History and Art and Architecture.
3. Limba Ganesh :- A Village in Beed taluka has note worthy temple of Ganesha has two inscriptions. The one gives the date sake salivahan 1114 vikrama samrat corresponding to A.D. 1192 and sake 1633 (A.D. 1711") of Jirnodhar i.e. repairs.
4. Parli Vajinath :- Vajinath Jyotirlingh Temple also known as Baidyath dham is one of the twelve jyotirilinga (sacred abodes of lord shiva). However, the location of vajinath jyotirilinga is disputed with other to location in Deogarh, Jharkhand and Baijnath Himachal Pradesh
5. Rakshashbhuvan (Shani Dev) :- Rakshashbhuvan is ancient temple located on the banks of River Godavari and dedicated to lord shani Dev. On occasim of shani Amavashya lot of devotes come to this place for blessing of shani maharaj. There is another temple of panchaleshwar, the god of Mahanubhava sect.
6. Manmath Swami Mandir, Kaplildhar :- Manmath Swami Was a great sunth of the lingayat sect of shaivism. He wrote humberous books and described the Abhanjas and astang acharan for common people. Manmath swami mandir is Samadhi of manmath swami. Manmath swami yatra held on occasion of kartik poornima in the month of November, December.
7. Shree shetra Narayangad :- Shree Shetra Narayangad is situated on top hill in shirur kasar taluka with 21 km from Beed Also known as dakti Pandhari, Shree shetra narayangad was founded by shree saint narayan maharaj. The stracture of the temple is Hemadpanthi in style and looks like a fort. The complex has swambhu Mahadev mandir, Vittal Rakhumai mandir and Nagad Narayan Mandir, Samadhis of Eight Saints. Other nearby important places is Gangaghat, old Dam, moti Talav, Annval fair is held an kartik poornima in the month of November / December.



8. Rameshwer Temple, Soutada :- Soutada village of Beed is famous for highest water fall in district and mahadev Temple. Mahadev temple in Rameshwer caves are mainly visited in the month of shraavan and waterfall also can be seen during monsoon.

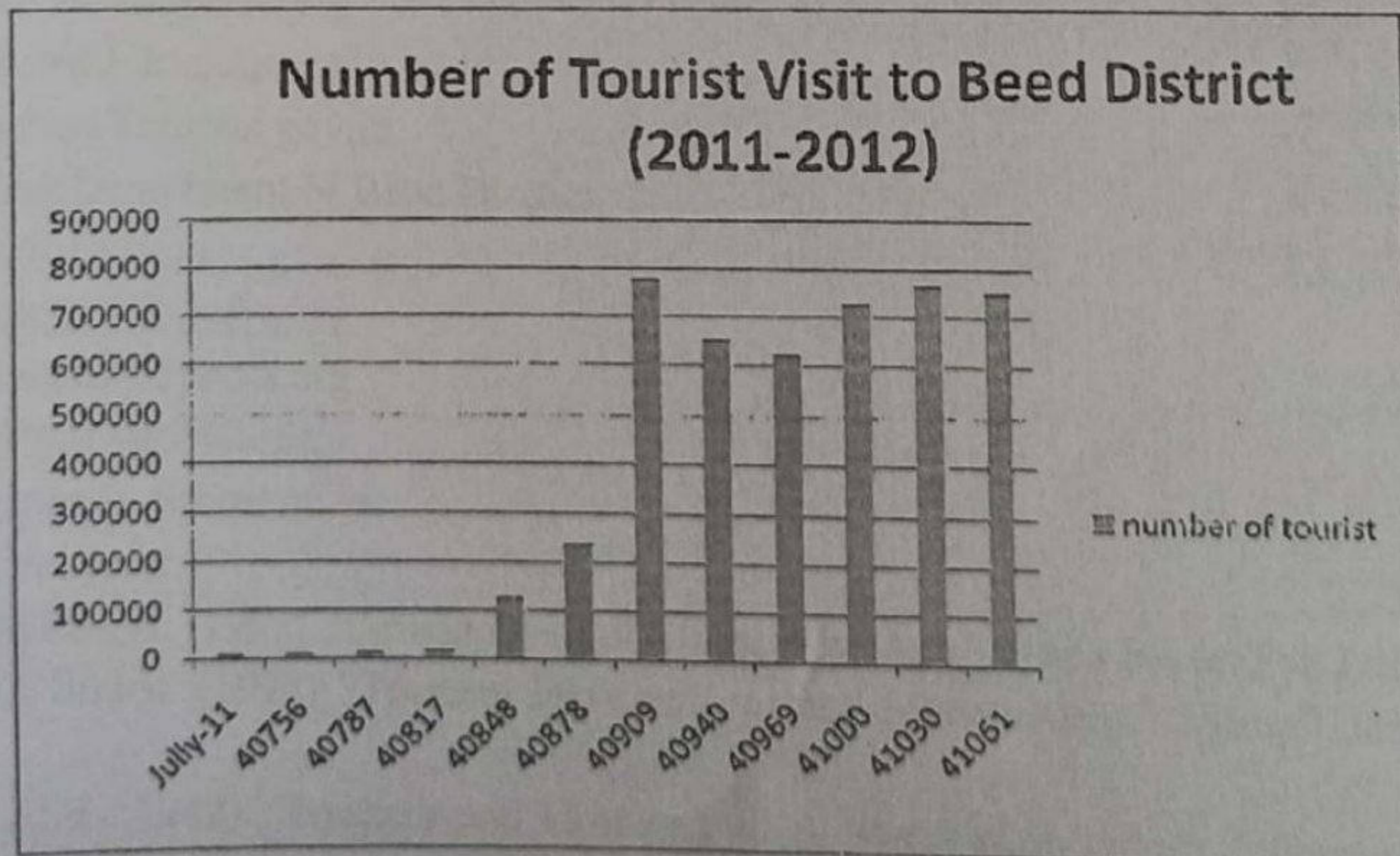
8. Tourist visit to Beed District (April- 2011 to March- 2012) :-

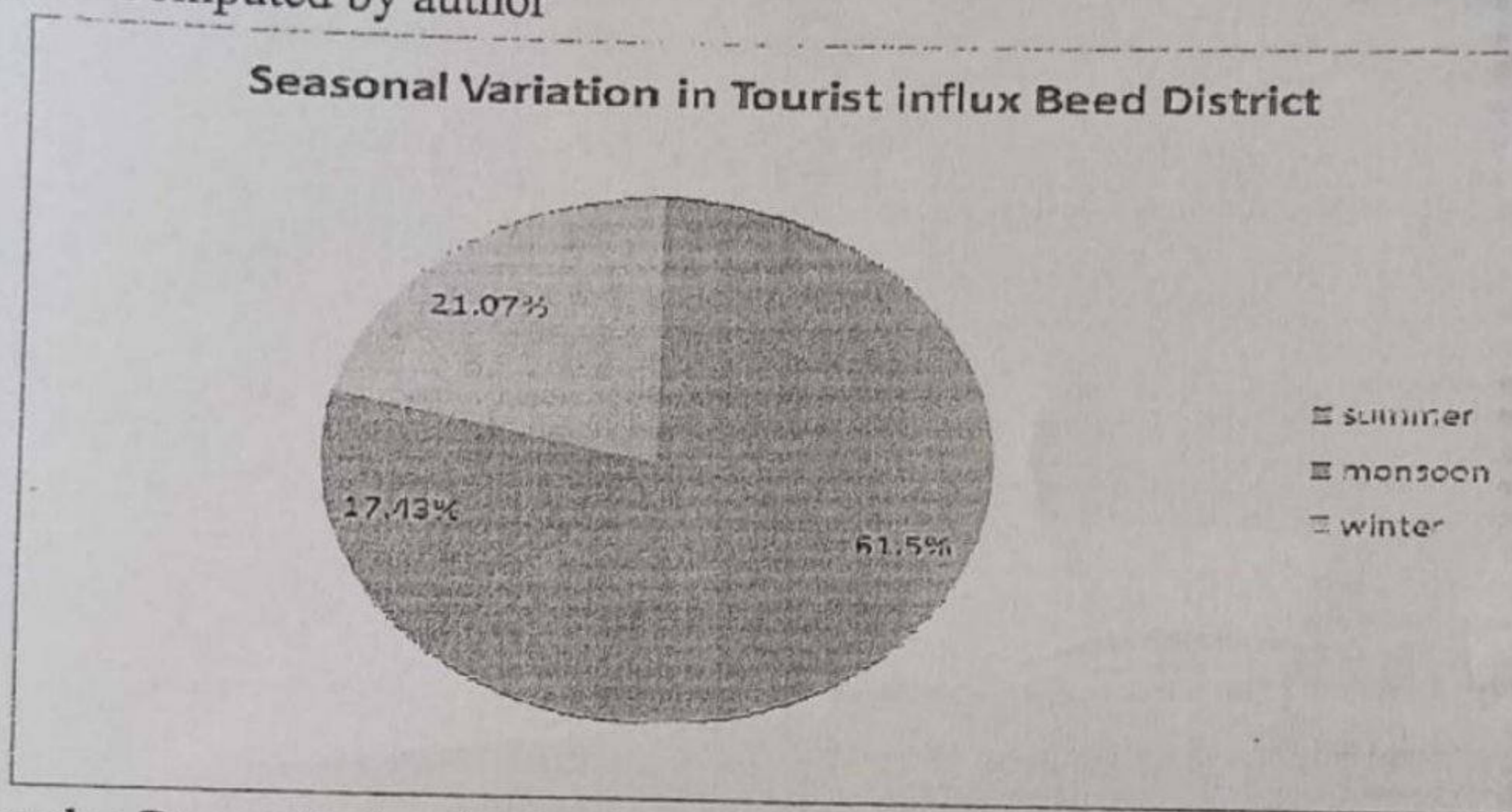
